Survey "Public opinion on the 29th anniversary of Ukraine's independence"

The survey was conducted by the Ilko Kucheriv Democratic Initiatives Foundation in cooperation with the Razumkov Center sociological service in cooperation with on 14-19 August 2020 in all regions of Ukraine, except Crimea and the occupied areas of Donetsk and Luhansk Regions. A total of 2022 respondents aged 18 and older were interviewed face-to-face at their place of residence, using a sample representative of the adult population. The theoretical sampling error does not exceed 2.3%.
